Vocational rehabilitation, also abbreviated VR or voc rehab, is a process which enables persons with functional, psychological, developmental, cognitive, and emotional disabilities, impairments or health disabilities to overcome barriers to accessing, maintaining, or returning to employment or other useful occupation.

The Individualized Education Program is a legal document under United States law that is developed for each public school child in the U.S. who needs special education. It is created through a team of the child's parent and district personnel who are knowledgeable about the child's needs.

This is more medical most parents know what a 504 Plan is if there child is placed on one:

* Section 504 of the U.S. Rehabilitation Act of 1973 is

designed to help parents of students with physical or mental impairments in public schools, or publicly funded private schools, work with educators to design customized educational plans. These 504 plans legally ensure that students will be treated fairly at school.

The basic difference between an IEP and a 504 plan can be summed up in one sentence: both plans provide for accommodations, but only an IEP provides for specialized instruction for students in grades K-12, while a 504 plan can serve students at both the K-12 and college levels.

Incident Report Guide

When an incident occurs in the foster home or while the child(ren) are in the care of the foster parent, the foster parent must report the incidents to a live person.

The foster parent is to contact the following persons in the following order until they reach a live person to receive the information:

A. During Working Hours, 9:00 am to 5:00 pm:

i. FCMA Case Manager/Supervisor

ii. FCMA Intake department if the Case Manager does not answer.

a. CFCE: 786-354-6888

b. CHS: 786-376-1629

c. FRC: 786-618-4256

d. WH Directors: 786-564-6321 and 305-394-1391

*Wesley House foster parent should contact the Directors. If unsuccessful, then contact Wesley House's CEO: 305-407-5724

iii. Citrus FCN Incident Report line at 305-455-2888, if no response from FCMA staff

B. After Working Hours:

i. FCMA Intake/On-Call Department

*Not applicable to Wesley House parents (skip to next step, step ii.)

ii. FCMA On-Call staff, if the FCMA Intake Department staff does not answer

d. WH: 305-809-4999

*Wesley House parents must call On-Call Staff, then if no answer, Directors or CEO
